In keeping with the tradition of hosting annual, non-US working group meetings (WGMs), HL7 Canada and HL7 International will be hosting the May 2012 Working Group Meeting in Vancouver, BC, May 13-18. This follows on the successful meeting in Vancouver in September 2008 where over 500 attendees participated in the working group meetings. The May 2012 WGM will be an excellent opportunity to understand and share Canadian HL7 experiences with the HL7 international community, specifically around HL7 Version 3 and the Clinical Document Architecture (CDA®) in provincial and national implementations — the EHR is active and growing in Canada!

# HL7 and IHTSDO Expand Collaborative Efforts

Up front coordination

will bring significant

improvements in global

Health Level Seven® International (HL7®) and the International Health Terminology Standards Development Organisation (IHTSDO®), the leading provider of standardized clinical terminology, have expanded collaborative efforts that began in March 2009 with the signing of an official Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). The closer collaboration will foster healthcare information interoperability and lead to improvements in patient safety by further facilitating the use of IHTSDO standards with HL7 standards.

IHTSDO and HL7 are jointly working on a number of key global healthcare information technology standards initiatives, including the following:

- IHTSDO is making SNOMED CT codes and descriptions freely available for release in HL7 products, under a public
  - good license, in order to improve semantic healthcare interoperability across countries and to improve patient safety. HL7 will use the codes and descriptions to produce a number of SNOMED-enabled products, using universal realm bindings to SNOMED CT where appropriate.
- HL7 is investigating use of the IHTSDO
   Workbench to maintain its vocabulary. Use
   of common tooling will improve harmoni zation, leading to benefits across the two
   organizations as well as for users of both
   standards.
- HL7 and IHTSDO are jointly reviewing and streamlining the request submissions process, to enable requests for additions and

amendments to SNOMED CT codes to be made more effectively. Improvements are being made in HL7's internal processes and also in IHTSDO's request submission process. The latter should improve submission of requests from all standards development organizations (SDOs).

 IHTSDO has announced its support for the development of Release 2 of the Common Terminology Services standard (CTS2) by

HL7 and OMG. This standard will provide a consistent interface into terminologies in EHR environments.

According to HL7 Board Chair Bob Dolin, MD, "Expanding on the coordination and collaborative efforts between HL7 and IHTSDO, these joint initiatives signify a major step toward the construction of globally appli-

cable healthcare interoperability standards that will require far less realm-localization. HL7 is committed to working with IHTSDO and other standards bodies to advance the delivery of safe and effective patient care."

IHTSDO Chief Executive Officer Jan-Eric Slot said, "Making it easier to use HL7 standards with SNOMED CT will facilitate global standards-based healthcare implementations, where it will add the semantic dimension to interoperability." He continued, "The closer working relationship between these two leading organizations will improve the uptake and effectiveness of these jointly developed standards by members of both HL7 and IHTSDO."




# Ambassador Program HL7 Standards for Electronic Health Record Technology: Meaningful Use and Other US Initiatives

PBS Metrics (Projects, Ballots and Standards) Report

The PBS Metrics Report (http:// gforge.hl7.org/gf/project/tsc/ frs/?action = FrsReleaseBrowse&frs\_ package id = 169) was created to support the HL7 Strategic Initiative to "streamline the HL7 standards development process." It is intended to be a tool to assist work groups with managing ballots in addition to cleaning up projects and old data. By reviewing the report, work groups can identify potential issues before they get out of hand as well as move items through balloting to a final document or standard state.

The Project Management Office (PMO) would like to thank all the work group co-chairs, project facilitators and everyone else that had a hand in cleaning up their 'red infractions' on the inaugural PBS Metrics report issued in May. The PMO will be issuing an updated report again in September.

The PBS Metrics team reviewed everyone's feedback and will continue to provide easier access to the data.

Enhancements have been made to the Reports link located on the www.HL7.org work group's pages, the Searchable Project Database as well as the PBS Metrics report itself.

The PBS Metrics Report is easily accessible via the Reports link on your work group's HL7.org page. This link directs you to GForge, where the report resides within the TSC's File area (http://gforge.hl7.org/gf/project/tsc/frs/ ?action = FrsReleaseBrowse&frs\_package\_id = 169).

As a reminder, the report reflects eight criteria for each work group:

- 1. Idle Ballots Items that haven't balloted in a year, and are still "open" (haven't successfully completed their ballot)
- 2. No Recon Package Items that have not had a reconciliation package posted
- 3. Non-Advancing Ballots Items that have gone through three or more ballots
- 4. Expired DSTUs Expired DSTUs that have not proceeded to normative or some other ballot level
- 5. Unpublished Ballots Items that are "finished" (passed by numbers and reconciliation is complete) but unpublished (not in Normative Edition or on HL7 Standards page)
- 6. Projects in Project Insight that are behind more than 120 Days
- 7. Projects in Project Insight with an 'Unknown' status
- 8. Work groups that do not have any 3-Year Plan Items in Project Insight



# News prom the PMO and Project Services Work Group

#### SAIF Pilot Coordination Project

Project Services is leading this project, which is sponsored by the Technical Steering Committee. The primary deliverable of the SAIF Pilot Coordination project will be to create concrete examples of artifacts that can be used in a future version of an HL7 SAIF Implementation Guide.

Additionally, SAIF Pilot Coordination will assist in the documentation of processes encountered throughout the development of projects under the SAIF AP (Architecture Program) umbrella – such as procurement of HL7 tooling software – and others that require input from more than one work group.

Overall, the project will document coordination conducted by over twelve HL7 work groups as they proceed through over nine projects under the SAIF AP umbrella. From this coordination, suggested contributions to SAIF governance documents will be created as well as modifications to the HL7 Project Life Cycle for Product Development (PLCPD).

Project Services is happy to be working on this effort to help move HL7 toward adoption of the SAIF architecture. We appreciate and welcome the contributions from all those involved in the SAIF AP projects.

Did you know? When Closing a Standards Project, Adhere to GOM Section 14.14
While working with co-chairs clean-

ing up projects based on the PBS Metrics, many were not aware of the policy stated in Section 14.14 of the **HL7 Governance and Operations Manual** (GOM) in regards to closing a standards project:

The TSC may discontinue a project involving a new HL7 Protocol Specification (§02.02) or revision to an existing HL7 Protocol Specification (a standards project) if the initiating work group has been:
a) unable to reach consensus necessary to bring the HL7 Protocol Specification to normative ballot within a year of project initiation; or

b) unable to successfully complete a normative ballot and move the HL7 Protocol Specification to publication within a year of initiation of a normative ballot

Given approval by three quarters of those in session when the motion is addressed, a work group may petition the TSC to discontinue a standards project regardless of its current status. The work group has the discretion to take this action for whatever reason it deems appropriate. The TSC shall have the final decision on a request to discontinue a standards project.

#### Adoption Process White Paper

Project Services has created a white paper focusing on "Introducing New Processes to HL7" in response to the TSC's request **(TSC GForge tracker**  #1681). This document proposes the approval and adoption methodology for non-standards process artifacts.

HL7 has a well defined methodology for producing standards, but the method to introduce new processes and move them to adoption and deployment

throughout the HL7 organization is more obscure/ad hoc. The "Introducing New Processes to HL7" white paper evaluates the issues and proposes a standard approach to introduce new processes to HL7. The proposed approach includes three steps for approval of a new process artifact: Initiation, Development and Validation. Adoption of a new process artifact includes three phases: Piloted, Endorsed and Implemented (which, when implemented, the new process will be deemed either encouraged or mandated). Lastly, an Appendix focused solely on Peer Review has been included for easy reference.

# HL7 Decision Support Service Standard Achieves Normative Status; Open-Source Implementation Available at OpenCDS.org

The HL7 Decision Support Service (DSS) standard, which provides a standard interface for accessing patient-specific inferencing capabilities, achieved unanimous approval in its May 2011 normative ballot. A joint effort by the HL7 Clinical Decision Support Work Group and the HL7 Services Oriented Architecture Work Group, the HL7 DSS

standard is a member of a family of healthcare services standards developed as a part of the Healthcare Services Specification Project (HSSP), which is a joint initiative between HL7 and the Object Management Group (OMG) to standardize the capabilities and interfaces of software services important to healthcare

(http://hssp.wikispaces.com).

An open-source implementation of the DSS standard is being developed by a multi-institutional effort known as OpenCDS (www.opencds.org). OpenCDS provides a complete solution for authoring, testing, and executing DSS knowledge modules to provide patient-specific clinical decision support capabilities. OpenCDS leverages a variety of open-source resources including the JBoss Drools rules engine and the Apelon terminology management system, and it provides an open-source implementation of the emerging HL7 Virtual Medical Record standard.

# HL7 Mentors: Extending a Helping Hand

At any HL7 working group meeting (WGM), there is a high probability that new participants will encounter at least a few familiar faces in the crowd who will share their WGM experiences and offer tidbits for a successful meeting. While such encounters are always welcome, HL7 International does in fact have a formal role for mentors with a role description and specific responsibilities.

Mentors are experienced HL7 members who help guide new HL7 attendees and support engagement in HL7 activities. You can expect to find mentors supporting a new HL7 attendee to effectively access materials, engage in topics of interest in a timely way, connect to appropriate resources and HL7 leaders and/or volunteers, and foster member participation in HL7 International activities.

Although mentoring activities are targeted primarily at HL7 International activities, guidance may also be extended to HL7 Affiliate engagement. Mentor activities are typically initiated at the working group meetings but mentors may, and are encouraged to, continue this relationships beyond the WGM. Communication is intended to be informal, collegial, and supportive, assisting the new attendees to get the most out of their HL7 membership and potentially growing into new future leaders and/or mentors.

The best mentors are not always the most senior or most technical experts HL7 members, but we strive to recruit

the best qualified and most experienced HL7 members in order to provide the optimal experience and assistance to new members. Our mentors may be experts either in HL7 content or organization/process to support new attendees' needs and should demonstrate the following attributes:

- Been a member of HL7 International for at least five years
- Held at least one co-chair or affiliate chair role
- Attended at least five working group meetings in the last five years
- Participated in at least five ballots in the last five years
- Have excellent interpersonal communication skills
- Have a clear and expressed interest in supporting first-time attendees and new HL7 members

The Process Improvement Committee (PIC) has responsibility for the Mentors and First-Time Attendee Program. Additionally, the International Mentoring Committee leverages mentors in their role of supporting potential new affiliates. New volunteers are always welcomed at both committees, and we especially invite those with multiple languages to consider becoming a mentor.

# **TSC** Newsletter Update

The TSC continues to work on Product Visibility, Product Quality, the SAIF Architecture Program and T3F Review. More information is available on each

of these efforts from the TSC web page under "Projects," at http://www.hl7. org/Special/committees/tsc/projects. cfm. In addition, the TSC continues maintenance of Work Group Visibility, as well as Work Group Health.

- Only 11 work groups will need to review their Mission and Charter (M&C) statements by the 2011 September Working Group Meeting (WGM). These M&C statements have not been reviewed for two years. Please review your Mission and Charter statements to keep them current! There are 14 work groups that need to update their Decision Making Practices (DMPs) in accord with the latest template. The TSC will also recognize the "healthiest" work groups at the 2011 September WGM. Three year planning should also be occurring annually, and 15 work groups are in need of notifying HQ when their plans have been updated.
- Innovations Project (PI #701) work has not seen new ideas advanced in quite a while, and without further suggestions the project will likely be cancelled by the September WGM. New innovative concepts can be

submitted for presentation and review on the Innovations wiki page at http://wiki.hl7.org/index.php?title = Innovations

- The SAIF Architecture Program (PI #751) is coordinating activities of the Product Quality project (PI #647), SAIF Pilot Coordination (PI #764), HL7 SAIF Implementation Guide (PI #763), and the SAIF Book balloting (PI #746)
- TSC Retrospective Self-Assessment Based on T3F Recommendations (PI #749)

The TSC also approved a number of new projects. You can always see the most recent list of new projects from the Project Insight Searchable Database. To show the projects most recently approved by the TSC, select "TSC Approval" from among the different date fields and then click "Filter Projects." By entering a date range you can see just the ones since the last WGM, or click the column heading over "TSC Approval Date" to bring the most recent TSC approvals to the top of the list.

# IHIC 2011 Recap

The 12th Annual International HL7 Interoperability Conference (IHIC 2011) was held May 13 and 14 in Orlando, Florida. This is the first time that IHIC has been held in the United States. The two-day meeting was conducted in a unique format with 16 invited speakers and 16 submitted papers presented. The theme of the conference was "The Tomorrowland of Health." Four half-day tracks discussed the topics of the future of personal health and digital devices, simulation and virtual environments, meaningful use, and next generation architectures.

The invited speakers provided summaries of the best current thoughts on patient centered health, game based education methods, sharing of simulated patients, personalized health, and health related devices connected to home and personal networks. Senior keynote speakers included Ken Lunn, PhD (NHS); John Halamka, MD (Harvard University); Jon Adams (FreeScale); Tom Jones, MD (Tolven); Jeffrey Taekman, MD (Duke University); Peter Greene, MD (Johns Hopkins); and Sasha Bojicic (Canada Health Infoway).

The submitted papers covered cutting edge developments in implementing HL7 standards in real systems. The 16 presenters represented initiatives underway in eleven countries. The topics discussed included greenCDA®, social networking, interoperability infrastructure, and information modeling. The presentations of the submitted papers were

a nice practical complement to the more theoretical and strategic ideas presented by the invited speakers. The discussion was lively during the sessions and even carried over into the conference's social networking event held at Jimmy Buffett's Margaritaville at Universal Studios CityWalk®.

The conference was a hit with everyone who participated due to the hard work of Stan Huff, MD;

# **HL7 Releases New Tool** for Capturing, Storing and **Managing CDA® Templates**

HL7 recently announced the release of the Trifolia Workbench, Consolidation Project Edition 1.0, Beta Release. This release supports standards authors, developers and implementers in capturing, storing and managing

HL7 Clinical Document Architecture (CDA) templates. It contains the full set of templates balloted through the HL7/IHE Health Story Consolidation Project, which harmonized health information exchange specifications for meaningful use of EHR technology. The project covered the HL7 Continuity of Care Document (CCD®) and the Health Story implementation guides for Discharge Summary, six other types of common clinical documents, and unstructured documents which can carry any clinical content. The tool will help developers and implementers localize and publish CDA templates.

Trifolia Workbench, Consolidation Project Edition 1.0, Beta Release features:

- **Template Repository:** A centralized database for CDA template management
- Structured Template Entry Tool: Enter, review, manage and localize/update HL7 CDA templates
- HL7 CDA Templates: Nearly 70 clinical templates from the HL7/IHE Health Story Consolidation Project
- **Publishing Tool:** Export templates to share within and outside your organization
- **Documentation:** Manuals to support installation and use

The Trifolia Workbench was developed by Lantana Consulting Group, who prepared this release for HL7 as a

resource to support adoption Trifolia Workbench Beta Release of the HL7/IHE Health Story supports standards development Consolidation Project. The Trifolia logical model is open and localization; includes library source so that implementers can use it to develop general templates and reference libraries. "We are excited to

> offer this release of Trifolia Workbench to HL7 members," said Rick Geimer, Chief Technology Officer, Lantana Consulting Group. "Our hope is that this release provides the informatics community with a useful tool for developing CDA templates."

"HL7's acceptance and offering of the Trifolia tool aligns nicely with the organization's current strategic initiatives," said John Quinn, HL7's chief technology officer. "We are very interested both in adopting tools that make our standard easier to implement and in developing end to end Version 3/CDA template infrastructure. This tool brings us a step closer to both of those goals."

Versions of the Trifolia Workbench have been developed by Lantana Group for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Child Health Corporation of America. It is one of several emerging tools addressing simplification of standards implementation. # **ACLA and HL7 Announce Approval of First-Ever Electronic** Directory of Services (eDOS) Implementation Guide

The American Clinical Laboratory Association (ACLA) and Health Level Seven® International (HL7®) recently announced the approval of the first-ever implementation guide in the laboratory industry for a reliable process to deliver a laboratory's electronic Directory of Service to those providers ordering laboratory services in a meaningful and constructive process.

The Version 2 Implementation Guide establishes a standard format for delivery of test compendium data elements that differ from laboratory to laboratory, including order codes, test descriptions, and specimen requirements. The guide is based on the Master File chapter of the HL7 Version 2.6 standard. As it was being developed, a number of proposed edits were incorporated into the guide, which also included the early adoption of change proposals to HL7 Version 2.8, to enable eDOS to provide all the necessary information to assist in the research, selection and ordering of laboratory tests.

Jason DuBois, vice president of government relations at ACLA said, "Standardization and interoperability are crucial elements in advancing the adoption of electronic healthcare. I am pleased that ACLA's members have collaborated to develop a framework for the electronic distribution of a Directory of Service for laboratories based on the HL7 standard. This interoperability standard for laboratory services is the first of its kind and sets the stage for similar collaborative efforts in other areas of the healthcare industry."

Use of this implementation guide will support the initial laboratory test compendium for each customer as well as ongoing maintenance updates throughout the life of the interface, regardless of the laboratory or electronic health record (EHR) system. The guide will allow EHR systems and other laboratory systems to automate the database update process for all laboratories so that services are ordered in one consistent manner. This will translate into newly developed tests, such as the one for the H1N1 virus, being made available for ordering on a timelier basis.

Doug Fridsma, MD, PhD, director of the office of standards and interoperability at ONC and HL7 International board member, commented, "I applaud the efforts of ACLA and HL7 to produce this first-ever standard for laboratory interoperability. It marks an important step in an ongoing journey toward full nationwide interoperable health information exchange and improved outcomes for patients."




